Candidate priority issues	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Healthcare - fought to increase Medicaid rates to help rural healthcare providers and nursing homes across the state; supported lowering the cost of Rx for seniors and families, reducing cost of insulin, approving \$225M for Covid relief, funding mental health and substance recovery services</li> <li>• Education - reducing costs of Running Start and College in the High School, establish Running Start in the summer, sponsored legislation to support paraeducators, fully fund public schools and special education programs</li> <li>• Family-Wage Jobs - champions legislation that ensures workers earn a living wage relative to the area in which they live; guarantees the right of unions to collectively bargain; mandates better parental leave policies, provides more childcare options, encourages more flexible work hours; requires pay transparency; build pathways to apprentice, community college and university programs</li> <li>• Environment - fought for legislation to reduce greenhouse gasses, transitioning to 100% clean electrical grid by phasing out coal production by 2025</li> <li>• Supporting veterans - granting veterans and their children instate tuition as they transition from military to civilian, ensure military who earned a campaign badge and/or medal receive full retirement benefits</li> </ul>
