During the 2016 session, House Bill 2872 enhanced Washington State Patrol recruitment, retention and pay raises to help address this issue. Improving school safety must be a top priority. In 2018, I voted in support of an amendment to provide \$30M for additional School Safety Resource Officers to be placed in schools across Washington. This legislation did not pass, but it absolutely should have become law."
