Candidate priority issues	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Jobs - Rivers Business Plan: measured incentives, regulation, permitting, accountability ● Schools - led the effort to give additional \$2.6B to schools while reducing tuition at community colleges and universities while not increasing taxes, sits on the Governor’s Task Force ● Sound budgeting - passed four year balanced budget reform bill ● Public safety - worked on DUI legislation, specifically a more comprehensive review of the offender’s criminal past, appearance before a judge for repeat offenders prior to release from jail, require time served for those who circumvent ignition interlock devices or operate a vehicle without one ● Transportation - focus is on reducing congestion, increasing freight mobility, increasing safety and supporting economic development
