### Part II – Free Response Questions

#### What is your idea of public safety?

To me public safety can be a lot of different things. Public safety can be how we treat people with addiction, reforms we put in place for law enforcement, and even how we treat people without housing. I think about public safety more as a goal, and whether we as a community feel safe. Right now there are people in my community who do not feel safe because of their skin color, including my own children. We have work to do to make sure the public feels safe.

Have you taken the <u>#ElectedsForJustice pledge</u>? If so, what actions do you intend to take to support the 5-part plan? If not, what points are barriers to your support, and why?

Yes I have proudly taken the #ElectedsForJustice pledge. One of the first things I want to address is use of force. We need to ban chokeholds, and have more restrictions on when police can use deadly force against people. We must also start holding officers who use excessive force more accountable. While I do not support the current "justice" system, until we build out restorative justice programs, cops who kill should be prosecuted and that rarely happens.

Under current state labor law, Collective Bargaining Agreements (CBAs) with law enforcement unions are often a barrier for meaningful police reform. What efforts do you support that differentiate police unions from other labor unions so that change can happen without eroding other workers' rights?

We need to recognize that law enforcement unions are already very different than other unions. What's going to be in a law enforcement union contract is going to be greatly different than teachers, nurses, or trade union contracts. I believe because law enforcement unions cover such different topics, they can be treated differently without negatively impacting the collective bargaining agreements of other unions. I have refused police union money in my campaign.
