	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • unions may collectively bargain for to exclude use of force, police oversight, and discipline; • Strengthen police training on anti-bias, de-escalation, being trauma informed, and community engagement; • Strengthen the de-certification process so that law enforcement officers who are found to have used excessive force cannot work in law enforcement; • Redirect some police functions and funding to community-based alternatives through social service and mental health agencies; • Limit the use of deadly force by prohibiting dangerous maneuvers like chokeholds; • Prohibit law enforcement officers to cover their badges while on duty; • Embrace harm reduction and non-policing alternatives.

To learn more, check out this ACLU link Criminal Justice Reform</p>	<p>The legislature must do more to fix our criminal justice system that has so significantly and disproportionately affected Black, Indigenous, people of color, and the poor. In the legislature I will fight to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep people out of the criminal justice system to begin with, reduce our prison population, and make zero youth detention a reality. The Legislature should invest more in quality early learning and K-12 education for all kids; sufficient mental health counselors, wraparound services, and development programs; and stop the practice of discrimination and disproportionate use of discipline against Black, Indigenous and people of color to end the school to prison pipeline; • Stop criminalizing poverty, homelessness, substance use disorder, and mental health by providing more resources for housing and treatment beds, mental health care, diversion programs from the criminal justice system, and more therapeutic treatment alternatives to incarceration; • Help justice involved persons successfully reenter society through access to education and workforce training while incarcerated and resources for successful reentry; • Increase access to therapeutic alternatives to traditional prosecution and incarceration; • Automate the vacation of old convictions when they are eligible for vacation to expeditiously and equitably clear criminal records. <p><u>IEWS ON GUN VIOLENCE:</u></p> <p>In the Legislature I will fight to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prohibit the sale of assault weapons and high capacity magazines that carry more than 10 rounds; • Require background checks on all ammunition and magazine purchases; • Require safety training before issuing a concealed pistol license; • Partner with local governments by removing the ban on local regulation so localities can strengthen gun safety laws tailored towards the community; • Support and fund community-based programs and treatment such as behavioral health and anger management to prevent and interrupt gun violence; • Allow firearm surrender orders issued in connection with a domestic violence protective order to be
